During the year, the Rotary Club of Beaver gave more than \$31,000 to the community, both in Beaver County and internationally. This included a joint effort with the five other Rotary clubs in Beaver County to raise more than \$200,000 to support the worldwide eradication of the dreaded polio disease.

Ours' is a Rotary Club of truly energetic, key business people who exhibit daily the ideals of Rotary. The object of every Rotarian, in their personal, business and community life, is to encourage and foster the ideal of "service above self." Through the diverse membership, we strive to achieve these ideals. We urge you to join us.

*Matthew Copcutt* – As we embark on the 2003-2004 year, I will be focusing on three major objectives to allow our club to realize more of its potential for outstanding community service. These include "Focus, Membership and Mentoring":

- Focus Establishing our niche in the community. We must vigorously support our fundraising efforts to keep that service at a high level. We will support several major fundraisers the Radio Auction, Ducky Derby and Geneva College Football Classic.
- *Membership* We have one of the larger clubs in Beaver County, but we need to continue to attract new members with fresh ideas and energy. - *Mentoring* To keep newer members interested and involved, we want to implement a new system whereby senior members are paired with new members over their first year to give them an understanding of the goals of Rotary and keep them engaged.




